

Professor Ching-Kuang Clive Tzuang received his B.S. degree in electronic engineering from National Chiao Tung University, Hsinchu, Taiwan, R.O.C., in 1977, the M.S. degree from the University of California at Los Angeles, in 1980, and the Ph.D. degree in electrical engineering from the University of Texas at Austin, in 1986. From 1981 to 1984, he was with TRW, Redondo Beach, CA. He became an associate professor at the Institute of Communication Engineering, National Chiao Tung University in 1986, and a full professor in 1991. In February 2004, he joined the Department of Electrical Engineering, National Taiwan University, where he conducted research on advanced guiding structures for RF sensor system-on-chip. His research activities also involved field-theoretical analysis and design of waveguide structures and large-array antennas for integrating RF systems in a package. In 2012, Dr. Tzuang became Professor Emeritus at National Taiwan University, and joined the faculty of Tianjin University, Tianjin, China, as a Distinguished Professor. Since 2010, he has been the Editor-in-Chief of the *IEEE Microwave and Wireless Components Letters*, the letter journal of the IEEE Microwave Theory and Techniques Society. Dr. Tzuang is a Fellow of the IEEE.
